## LISD Virtual Education

Lindale ISD holds the core belief that students learn better and are more academically successful when under the direct instruction of a teacher in the classroom. Recent data strongly supports that students need to be in-person learning in the classroom to better perform academically.

Therefore, LISD will use virtual learning on short-term placement with the expectation that students will return back to the classroom setting. Students that test positive for the COVID-19 virus will be placed on virtual learning (At-Home Learning) for five calendar days. Parents should contact school officials to give notice of the positive test and plan for the transition to At-Home Learning.

Students that are directly exposed to COVID-19 should contact school officials to determine if the student should be quarantined. If the student is approved for quarantining because of exposure to COVID-19 then the student will be placed on At-Home Learning.

Students that are considered virtual or At-Home Learners will be counted present if they complete assignments in CANVAS. If a student completes no assignments in CANVAS the student will be counted absent for the day.

Virtual Education will be for short-term placement of 5 days or less. Any exception to this 5-day rule must be approved by the superintendent.

## STATE ATTENDANCE ACCOUNTABILITY

- 1. Campus principal or designee will approve or disapprove requests for virtual education.
- 2. Campus PEIMS Clerk will list the students approved for virtual education on the campus virtual education form.
- 3. Campus principal or designee will be responsible for determining the attendance of virtual education. This should be completed daily. If a student works in CANVAS, the student will be considered present for the school day.
- 4. PEIMS Clerk will use the campus virtual education form to enter attendance data for virtual education students.
